

This is the last Will <sup>AND</sup> Testament of me  
James Moody

of the Parish of Whippingham in the Isle of Wight Copseman made  
this twenty sixth day of July One thousand eight hundred and sixty nine  
First I resign my soul to Almighty God and direct that my body be  
decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named And  
next I give devise and bequeath and appoint my freehold cottage  
and premises at Coppins Bridge in the Parish of Whippingham  
(and which I recently purchased) and now occupied by Henry Board  
unto and to the use of my son Charles absolutely free from any  
charge or incumbrance And I charge my residuary property with the  
payment of my debts And subject thereto I give <sup>devise</sup> and bequeath and  
appoint my two freehold cottages and land at Bartons Village in the  
Parish aforesaid and all other my estate and effects unto and to the  
use of my three daughters Martha Ralph Frances Finson and Ellen Jones  
their heirs executors and administrators and assigns as tenants in common  
and not as joint tenants for their sole and separate use and independent  
and free of their husbands or their debts or control in every respect And if  
either of my said daughters should die before me leaving lawful issue then I  
give the share of the deceased to her issue And I hereby appoint my said  
son and Joseph Jones of Bartons Village Tailor Executors of this my Will  
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand the day and year aforesaid.
